These are things that kind of rose to the top of my mind as I was thinking about my own career and the kind of people who I typically help, which are, you know, just.

End users looking to make things you know easier, more efficient, more productive.

Give them time back and I tried to split them up to different categories, different focus areas across.

Microsoft 360.

Five, and I feel like maybe just because I've been working with it a lot recently, data visualization is a huge topic that we see where people have tons of data, but maybe not the time or resources to actually be able to sift through it and find the story they're trying to tell with it, or to take action on that data.

So I think it was a couple years ago now, but.

Power BI, of course, got its integration moment with SharePoint where now with your list and your libraries and SharePoint you can go to the integrate button and then choose Power BI and then something called visualize the.

List and I talk about it a lot.

00:08:00 Nate Chamberlain

I like to share this one with people because sometimes when we hear power platform more power BI or anything that sounds, you know not word or excel like then we say oh, that's beyond my skill set.

It's not something I have the time or energy to learn and to do, but what's really beautiful about this option that's built into SharePoint is that it takes the data.

Or the library that you have and it gives you an instant report.

It kind of, you know, feeds through the dates that you have in your list, the currency, whatever it is, categorical that you might have in there and it gives you bar charts, line charts, big data cards as a starting place for your.

Now, as you might guess, whenever we lean on machines to bring in that kind of stuff and do the work for us, there's mistakes.

So of course you do want to tweak it a little bit, swap a column for this, get rid of a chart, add a chart.

But you do it all in the browser.

You don't need to install heavy software.

You don't really need to learn too much to get off the ground.

Very cool. We, we.

00:08:56 Joe

Have often talking to our users and episodes we'd like to use Microsoft forms to take data and push it into.

Often we'll we'll talk about pushing it into a SharePoint list.

00:09:09 Joe

So we have scientists out there, researchers.

00:09:14 Joe

Some of our extension agents we talked a lot about a lot.

00:09:17 Joe

We'll go collect information from the public or from a field research they're doing and collect that into a SharePoint list. 00:09:25 Joe So what you're saying is? 00:09:27 Joe The Power BI connector to a list where now their data. 00:09:31 Joe Is is kind of it. 00:09:33 Joe It gives them. 00:09:33 Joe That first draft. 00:09:35 Joe Of a report. 00:09:35 Joe What you're saying? 00:09:36 Joe So that kind of that's how that. 00:09:39 Nate Chamberlain Yeah, I think the the nice thing about like if you start from scratch, let's say we don't have this integration that you have to install Power BI desktop or rely on the very limited web version. 00:09:49 Nate Chamberlain But let's say you start with desktop. 00:09:51 Nate Chamberlain You have to 1st connect to your data, so you'd be connecting to a SharePoint online. 00:09:54 Nate Chamberlain And even that step can be intimidating for users. 00:09:57 Nate Chamberlain It's not as straightforward as you'd think it might be.

So that that can sometimes, you know, turn people off and it ends there with this integration, it basically skips that whole data connection step and it even models it for you in the background and you skip straight to report building and it pre populates with those visuals saving you basically 3/4 of the process of getting to that point.

00:10:18 Dewayne Wow, that's awesome. 00:10:20 Dewayne II have to admit. 00:10:23 Dewayne This is going to sound bad. 00:10:24 Dewayne I have seen that. 00:10:26 Dewayne Button and I've never pushed it. 00:10:29 Dewayne I'm going to now. 00:10:30 Nate Chamberlain There we go. 00:10:32 Joe It sounds like a really easy. 00:10:33 Never too late. 00:10:34 Joe Easy way to. 00:10:35 Joe To get past that first intimidation point of like what is power BI, how do I build a report? 00:10:42 Joe You have something to start with. 00:10:44 Joe

That you can start tweaking and justice.

00:10:46 Joe

Understand how it gets built, how it how it looks even across your data.

00:10:52 Joe

That's really great.

00:10:54 Joe

That's a great tip.

00:10:55 Joe

I think we've got, I know I've got people that could take advantage of that to at least at least start getting familiar with power.

High, great place to start.

00:11:06 Dewayne

Joe pointed out something some of our our special part of our audiences, the in the land grant system, there's the Cooperative Extension program, which is a national program where we have these agricultural professionals that are helping people in the in their community learn how to do things.

And oftentimes they are collecting data samples.

00:11:28 Dewayne

Maybe they're working with a group.

00:11:30 Dewayne

Or logging or the growers letting us use part of their field for experimentation, which is pretty cool.

And one of the use cases for forms that we've had that was that was pretty powerful was so nicely formatted on a mobile device or like an iPad and they could be in the field taking data readings.

You know which is so much easier than trying to type into an Excel spreadsheet with a with an iPhone or an Android phone.

Right.

00:11:57 Dewayne

You know so true.

00:12:00 Dewayne

And so now what you're saying is if we with a little bit of extra steps.

Shoving that into a SharePoint list, there could be an automated visualization of that data happening at the same.

Yeah, that's right.

00:12:13 Nate Chamberlain

Yeah, it's it's nice to kind of see some of this come together because we've been getting pieces of the puzzle for a long time, just one at a time.

And with the announcement of Copilot and everything, it just starts to get you thinking like we've come this far.

So next logically, doesn't it kind of feel like we could just say create a dashboard out of my data, you know, not just a generic.

Trying to get you started but create one that tells the story of this overtime or show me how the breakdown of this looks by using my data and maybe it gets even easier.

I love that this is now like this.

00:12:45 Dewayne

Isn't this isn't something that, like copilot and the news and the AI, you know, it's all.

It's huge, but it still kind of feels like we're still hurry up and wait mode and this you could.

Do today, so yeah, absolutely.

00:12:57 Joe

If you've got someone who is familiar in Excel, let's say maybe they're comfortable with a a pivot table or or just charting in Excel, what do you think that transition is like going into power BI?

I always say if you come into power BI with like a formula level knowledge of Excel where you feel comfortable creating maybe some complex formulas beyond just basic summing, you're going to do really well and that's only if you want to do things in power BI that are beyond your data like you want to do measures or you want to do additional calculations.

Otherwise, if you've come into it, you know with, you know, like you mentioned power or sorry pivot table experience and all of that, it's actually very similar and power BI was born out of Excel Power query editors.

So there's a lot of similarity and familiarity those users are going to have.

Yeah, if you're a pivot table ninja, then you're already one step ahead and I can barely make a bar chart.

00:13:52 Dewayne

But yeah, I'm definitely gonna push that button later.

I think the first thing I'm going to type into this copilot thing in the future is please make me a pivot table.

I think that's the.

00:14:03 Joe

Key right there. Yep.

00:14:07 Nate Chamberlain

The true test.

00:14:08 Dewayne

Yeah, love it.

00:14:11 Dewayne

Cool. Well, that, that's.

00:14:12 Dewayne

A heck of a start, man.

00:14:15 Nate Chamberlain

Well, hopefully the next ones are.

Good, too awesome.

00:14:18 Dewayne

I'm sure they will be.

00:14:19 Dewayne

Let's what's what's your number?

00:14:20 Nate Chamberlain

Two, alright, so #2 for this one. It's reminders and notifications. This is another listen libraries focused tip. In fact, the first three are all about listen libraries. But again, just thinking about the users, I typically work with and have worked with.

For a while now, are those who again have this data, but now they need to do more with it.

00:14:40 Nate Chamberlain

And reminders and notifications sound simple, you know, like, oh, I just want to know when this is due.

00:14:45 Nate Chamberlain

I want to know when this is assigned to me.

00:14:47 Nate Chamberlain

I'd like to get a weekly digest of all the changes that happen in the list, but there's too many options these days.

00:14:53 Nate Chamberlain

We've got we've got alerts in SharePoint list and libraries which are kind of a digest experience.

00:15:00 Nate Chamberlain

We've got rules which aren't unlike setting up an outlook rule, and it's pretty simple to do, but it's still pretty basic and it's like I want to know when this column value changes from pending to approved, and then we've got power automate.

And now we're we're being encouraged to, you know, create reminders and notifications using power.

00:15:21 Nate Chamberlain

And so with all three of these.

00:15:22 Nate Chamberlain

Sometimes users get.

00:15:23 Nate Chamberlain

And they're like, well, I have all these options and they're all on the same ribbon menu at the top of the list and library.

00:15:29 Nate Chamberlain

And they're like, I don't know the pros and cons.

00:15:30 Nate Chamberlain

I don't know when to use.

00:15:32 Nate Chamberlain

It's and to me it really comes down to what you're looking for out of it.

If we start at the simplest, it's the alerts.

00:15:39 Nate Chamberlain

The alerts on lists and libraries allow you to say I'd like to know when something like anything is deleted when something has changed.

00:15:46 Nate Chamberlain

Maybe you only care if something was changed that you created.

00:15:49 Nate Chamberlain

You can do all that with alerts and it's basically you fill out the form for the alert you want.

00:15:53 Nate Chamberlain

Click save and it comes to you.

00:15:56 Nate Chamberlain

So the other two, then the second one was going to be the rules and rules are a little bit more finetuned, but just as easy to set up if you can fill out a form, you can set up a rule as well.

And the rule says I still want to know when something is deleted, but you can send it to someone else.

00:16:12 Nate Chamberlain

You can send it to yourself.

00:16:13 Nate Chamberlain

It gives you a little bit more flexibility, but it still comes through looking.

Very simple, not a lot of customization in that actual notification, but I think for rules the more viable use case is status changes, like if you're involved in a process where approvals are.

Pertinent then you could say I want to know when it goes from pending to approved or when it goes from submitted to pending.

00:16:35 Nate Chamberlain

You know something like that where we can't really do that with alerts that specifically we can say I want to know when something is added or something has changed, but we can't get as specific to say when this thing changes.

So I'll pause there.

00:16:48 Nate Chamberlain

We can talk about those two.

00:16:49 Nate Chamberlain

And then we can always get into power automate more as well, where it's the most customizable.

00:16:53 Joe

The alerts alerts in SharePoint have been there forever.

00:16:59 Joe

That's been I think that's a hidden little gem.

00:17:03 Joe

I like to point that out for a team owners who want to kind of, I kind of recommend go put an alert for deletions like just get a, you know, just get a a weekly whatever alert of of things and it's not.

00:17:18 Joe

You're not tracking who's deleting things, but it's early on, it's gotten better.

00:17:23 Joe

Early on, it was not uncommon for somebody to accidentally Unsync A-Team channel. Yeah, yeah, exactly. And there goes the whole channel. And just having that safety net of realizing.

00:17:29 Dewayne

By using the delete button.

00:17:39 Joe

Something major has happened well within the time frame of of our, you know, 93 days to go recover, I think was a a good safety net and has helped helped us move more users into the cloud and into teams giving them that understanding that you know you you've got back up there and you've got some notification capability. So yeah, taking advantage of.

00:18:01 Joe

That's one way.

00:18:02 Joe

Find very useful, but it, like I said, that's that's old school.

00:18:07 Joe

It's kind of hidden and and rules are kind of sort of a new way.

00:18:12 Joe

So those can take advantage, like you said a little.

00:18:14 Joe

You can tweak those a little bit better around who gets notified and things like.

00:18:18 Dewayne

That, and I'll think, I think I'll throw in here.

00:18:20 Dewayne

Just, I mean obviously this is audio only, so people can't see what we're talking about.

00:18:24 Dewayne

But if you look.

00:18:25 Dewayne

Looking at, for example, the contents of a channel in SharePoint, you'll see these things on the NAV bar at the top where you can manage your alerts.

00:18:35 Dewayne

You'll see an automation menu if you click the three dots or what we like to call the meatball menu.

00:18:41 Dewayne

Does it ever look like 3?

00:18:42 Dewayne

Little meatballs to the ellipsis.

00:18:43 Joe

It's lunchtime right now is a recording, right?

00:18:47 Nate Chamberlain

I like meatballs better.

00:18:50 Dewayne

But you'll see rules and you'll see the ability to set up alerts.

00:18:54 Dewayne

And yeah, the delete one is a big one that Joe and I have have tried to push people for using.

00:19:00 Dewayne

You know, it could generate noise, but you can use rules and outlook to kind of like funnel that somewhere just so that you have the history.

00:19:08 Dewayne

Of of what was going on so.

00:19:10 Nate Chamberlain

And I think just that final step, I mean we get the idea we we kind of know when we want to be alerted and we we have an awareness of the kinds of things that are happening in the list and library.

So that final pieces maybe for the more advanced users, but I don't want to discourage anybody from trying and power automate notifications in our mind.

Matters because you'll notice at the top of your SharePoint list and libraries.

You can start from a template and that template is just send me a reminder when the due date approaches are send me a notification when XYZ happens and you just have to tweak a few things.

The only barrier to entry there might be, depending on how much customization you want to do.

Do you want to put in rich text?

00:19:48 Nate Chamberlain

Do you want to bring in additional details about the item itself?

Those kinds of things may take just a little bit of discovery.

But just like you were talking about the easy way to kind of get that person into power BI with lists.

Choosing that type of automation and opening up power automate to the user is that same kind of that first step, that first draft to understanding that.

Kind of kind of a great way to help the adoption of those is it's it's safe.

00:20:19 Joe

You know, these are very clear templated.

00:20:22 Joe

You're going to work when you select this and then you can start.

00:20:25 Joe

Building upon those.

00:20:29 Dewayne

Are you an extension agent?

00:20:31 Dewayne

Just getting started with teams, or maybe your experience, but you're looking to improve your digital cloud skill set.

Are you an IT pro supporting extension programs at your university?

OK, now what?

And so having the templates there like I just clicked on it just to see what it suggested right off the bat.

The very first one is like send a customized e-mail whenever a new file is added.

You could take that.

00:21:37 Dewayne

And build off of that and add more, you know, actions off of it.

00:21:41 Dewayne

And so it gets you started without you having to start literally from zero, which I feel like is really encouraging.

Yeah, that's a huge leg.

00:21:50 Joe

What I what I like about these is it's not just on a list, but you can do things on a document library against files too, which is pretty special.

You know, not going to get in a standard traditional Windows file share.

00:22:07 Joe

You're not going to get these kind of capabilities.

00:22:10 Joe

Of acknowledging when somebody's updated a PDF, you know standard operating procedure file and you'll want everybody to know about it. That stuff you can do in the cloud.

Hey, this policy was just updated and then it fires off a notification to everybody in the team to let them know it was.

00:22:26 Dewayne

Updated. That's cool.

00:22:28 Nate Chamberlain

Yeah, that's awesome.

00:22:28 Nate Chamberlain

I like that.

00:22:31 Dewayne

All right, moving right along, we, we might need 6:00 and 8:00, we'll.

00:22:34 Dewayne

See how fast this goes.

00:22:36 Joe

Up in your back pocket.

00:22:38

Got it all.

00:22:41 Nate Chamberlain

And I could always talk about this all day like this is this has been a lot of.

Fun so thanks again.

For having me. Yeah. Yeah. Let's get into three. So this one's about analysis and review.

And we're not thinking analysis like data visualization and this one.

We're not sending it as a reminder, but we're working with it where it lives and something that I think is often overlooked, at least in a lot of my experience, has been.

Something as simple as grouping, filtering. You know creating views, those kinds of things on the list or library. Sometimes we stick just with what comes out-of-the-box.

We have the all documents view or the all items view and then I'll witness users who will do the same filtering over and over again, filtered at this department, sort by this filter to this status and then.

Export to you know.

00:23:29 Nate Chamberlain

SV And it's those repetitive actions you mentioned earlier, Co pilots kind of taking away some of the mundane things.

This is a mundane thing where we we do those things again and again.

So if we start using views in the upper right hand corner and if you're just getting started with views in SharePoint, just click on where it says all items or all documents in the upper right hand corner.

And then you can create additional views and all that means is you're basically saving pre configured filters, groupings, sort orders and all of that into what feels a little bit like a report.

So some examples I usually suggest to people are both dynamic and static.

Examples of dynamic views would be items that are assigned to me.

You can have it set up so that if you're working through an issue tracker list, for example, and an issue is assigned to you to resolve, then you can have a view.

That's just my issues, right?

00:24:21 Nate Chamberlain

And it's dynamic because it's looking up your identity.

00:24:24 Nate Chamberlain

With that people column that's in.

00:24:25 Nate Chamberlain

List and another dynamic example is roll in dates.

We think about items that are coming due in the next two weeks.

00:24:32 Nate Chamberlain

So we can say take today's date, add 14 to it for two weeks and then anything that falls within that date span will show up in that view.

Or like I said, it's kind of like a report, a way we could think about it that way and then static.

00:24:44 Nate Chamberlain

These are a little more traditional we're thinking.

00:24:46 Nate Chamberlain

I want to group this by department, so right at the the high level I can see I've got 30-4 items for HR.

I've got 22 for IT and I can expand and kind of drill up and drill down through that grouping or even a subgrouping level.

Through my list and library and then an even easier one would be status right, approved items, completed items pending, open opportunities so on and so forth.

The traditional issues we have with Excel, where you've got a bunch of data in Excel and you're sharing this file with people and someone wants it sorted.

Anyway, and they make that change.

00:25:22 Joe

It's saved now.

00:25:24 Joe

Everybody gets it the way that I wanted it sorted, but somebody else didn't want that issue.

So is that kind of something that's solved with these views?

Are they like, if I create a view and I'm looking at that view, nobody else, I'm not forcing.

00:25:39 Joe

Anybody else on the SharePoint list to see that same view?

00:25:43 Nate Chamberlain

Yeah, that's right.

00:25:44 Nate Chamberlain

So you actually have the option.

00:25:45 Nate Chamberlain

You can have your own views that are private to you and you can also have shared views that you and your team work together on.

So by default your list or library is going to have a default view, which just means when they first go there and they're not going to a specific URL or anything, then they're going to be taken.

To that view.

00:26:01 Nate Chamberlain

Typically you're all items, or you're all documents, unless you've changed it.

And then let's say we're working with some shared views that might be grouped by department.

We might use it for different.

Analysis from time to time, but it's not something you know that's private to one person.

But then let's say you specifically focus on the Northeast region of the.

States and you're kind of the only person who manages those accounts or whatever the issue may be, and you create what's a private view, meaning that it's not even going to show up as an option for other people on your team.

But it's something you can have where you filtered it exactly how you want it.

You took out the columns that you don't need to see.

00:26:39 Nate Chamberlain

Maybe you grouped it by a certain status.

That's really critical.

00:26:41 Nate Chamberlain

Your work to help you get things done as quickly as possible.

00:26:46 Dewayne

I think it's important to to note out something that Joe has tried to drill into my head since him and I started working together on SharePoint is that everything is a list.

Is what he told me.

00:26:57 Dewayne

Everything is a list.

00:26:59 Dewayne

You're looking at folders.

00:27:01 Dewayne

Those are all like fake.

00:27:02 Dewayne

Everything is a giant list, so even when you're looking at files.

00:27:06 Dewayne

It's all just one big list, and so a lot of.

00:27:09 Dewayne

People correlate a a folder view in SharePoint to be the similar to like your traditional legacy like file share and that's not the case.

00:27:20 Dewayne

There's all kinds of extra bits of information that you can.

00:27:23 Dewayne

Add that you could add on to it and one of the things that you said that I thought was really cool was the dynamic capabilities of, let's say, a new file gets created in any files that get pushed into this particular folder.

You need to do something with them within two weeks.

00:27:40 Dewayne

You know you could have a view that says show me everything.

00:27:43 Dewayne

That's older than two weeks, so these are the the late ones, so to speak or whatever.

00:27:48 Dewayne

You know that you could, you could add there.

00:27:50 Dewayne

When you look at files and folders and.

00:27:51 Dewayne

Windows it's just file.

00:27:53 Dewayne

Explorer, there's not really a whole lot you could do there.

00:27:56 Dewayne

You know, but you can really slice and dice things.

00:27:58 Dewayne

And and I like, I like where you're going with this is the the analysis you could do of the data where it lives and how different people, different stakeholders, kind of kind of consume it.

So that's that's pretty cool.

Yeah, it's really flexible.

00:28:13 Nate Chamberlain

And yeah, we just get started with fuse, right?

We could go on. We could keep talking about conditional formatting and all of these things that give us that kind of excel like feel where it's not just, you know, filtering and sorting. But we're also flagging things and we're giving it a visual identity to say, oh, that one's.

Yeah, Mark it in Red, Joe.

00:28:30 Dewayne

We've done some stuff like that.

00:28:31 Dewayne

And Joe, I have been listening, see all those things you've.

That's great to hear.

00:28:38 Dewayne

Yeah, it took a few years, but.

Something I I think would be good to talk about here right now is the the concept of in order to group something or to to filter you you need the data in there and I.

When someone's making a list or they started with a list, there's a bunch of columns that are already there.

But I think emphasizing the concept around a document library.

You can add more columns there too and it's.

00:29:08 Joe

I don't I don't.

00:29:09 Joe

I don't think it's as obvious.

00:29:11 Joe

I mean, there is a, you know, at a column it shows up there, but the concept and the thought around adding some data that is not something I traditionally think about a file is something I I think be great to kind of talk a little bit deeper about is what you know adding some adding.

Extra metadata to a file is something that we can't do on a file server, but we get that in a document library in SharePoint.

00:29:38 Nate Chamberlain

Yeah, you know, I've seen a lot of that with one specific example that I've seen in multiple companies is versioning.

00:29:44 Nate Chamberlain

Think about your policies and sops that you brought up earlier and SharePoint of course has IDs which mean as soon as you drop a file into a library, it's version one.

00:29:52 Nate Chamberlain

And then we could do minor versioning 1.11.2 or major 1234, but that's kind of, you know, out-of-the-box and we can't control it very much.

00:30:01 Nate Chamberlain

So when we're, you know, making changes to the document, we're checking it out, checking it in, we're controlling it the most.

00:30:07 Nate Chamberlain

But by default we're just overriding it's auto saving and those version numbers get out of control real fast.

So for people who are in really strict environments, like government employees, for example, they need the version of the document like literally on the document itself to say this is version 6.7, right?

And then SharePoint say Oh no, this is version 312.2.

00:30:28 Nate Chamberlain

You know, so.

00:30:30 Nate Chamberlain

We kind of have that that, you know, discrepancy there.

00:30:33 Nate Chamberlain

So one thing I've seen a lot is in document libraries to add, you know, a separate version column or you know not the ID column either.

I'm still talking about like a completely new column for.

00:30:43 Nate Chamberlain

Version that face up says this is that version which yeah.

00:30:46 Dewayne

Like your internal version, like what your corporation.

00:30:49 Dewayne

Your entity says this is version XYZ, Not what SharePoint says it is, right?

Right.

00:30:56 Nate Chamberlain

And you know, we also get columns like created by, modified by and when we think about these views with that, we now have the right version number face up.

We have, you know, who created it and who modified it last, and these can be views.

Think about a drag and drop library where you're submitting paperwork.

And maybe it's still PDFs and I'm sorry to anybody who has to deal with that, but it's a reality, right?

We still have these kind of digitized forms that aren't quite completely modernized yet.

And so with those we take those forms, we drop them into a library.

And then since it's created by you in that case, you could say the dynamic view where it's created by me could be my forms, my submitted paperwork, you know, something like that where you have this kind of privatized almost repository.

Now of course, we want to think about.

Data privacy and all that too.

It's a bigger conversation, but just an idea.

Travel receipts or something like that.

And just if you've got a view that's set to yourself, you can easily confirm that I remembered to, you know, to get those charges up there someplace for the finance team to see them grab those.

Yeah, and add columns for location.

It could even have the amount in a column like you could do all kinds of stuff.

Just with files as the core piece of information.

So like everything is a list.

So with that, it's like the only difference is lists don't have to have documents.

It's kind of how I tell people about it.

And then of course the document library you have to have that foundation.

I think when Joe and I started rolling out teams at our organization, we recognized that the power and the complexity of SharePoint scared a lot of people.

So we didn't actually tell anybody that that's where their stuff was early on, you know, we were like.

Hey look, it's teams and here's a channel and you can put your stuff in it.

00:32:46 Dewayne

And isn't it amazing?

And then, like, two years later, we're like haha, everybody, guess what?

00:32:51 Dewayne

It's all in.

00:32:52 Dewayne

However, in this conversation, I think it's really important and sorry I didn't mean that to.

Be deceiving, but people to have this preconceived notion of complexity when there wasn't any teams really simplified permissioning and access by just add them to the team and they have access to the stuff.

And so I think it's important though to point out here that relationship that those two, those two things have in your files tab inside of teams, all these amazing things that Nate talked about with views and creating views, those are still there.

In the teams files tab like you could you don't have to go to SharePoint to see this stuff and to have this grouping and sorting and and this capability you can do all of this stuff directly in.

How you view?

Things in teams and so if you had a really unique use case where everybody had to view files a certain way, you could create that view and then create.

We've had that ability to delay emails for.

Like we have sure it's it's been a long time.

Very long time.

00:35:06 Nate Chamberlain

So that's nothing new.

But now we're seeing that same kind of delay functionality for teams chat messages where we can say, oh, I want to be cognizant of their business hours.

I want to know when they're on vacation that they don't have to, or I want them to know that they don't have to answer me when they're on vacation.

Kind of thing, like all kinds of scenarios where we want to delay that send so that it hits at the optimal time.

So we've got both of those now e-mail, we've got teams and then we've also seen integration across these where you know a lot of outlook components are surfaced through teams.

We've got our calendar there, that's just your outlook calendar, right?

We've got the ability to schedule our out of office without leaving teams, giving us again that kind of you know single.

Yeah. So beyond chat, we're thinking about pages. You mentioned, you know, sharepoint's behind the files and teams. We're also able to pin pages and news as tabs inside of our channels.

And so when we start thinking about bringing more and more into teams like that and we add in this ability to schedule news, we're really creating a robust kind of engagement platform.

But right now you can send somebody a chat and it's really nice that because of time zones, you know, if you work in a in a, let's say a company that spans an entire geography or multiple time zones, we have two whole, we have two whole time zones here in Florida.

But now we're getting this kind of pivot towards, you know, well-being we're thinking about mental health we're thinking about. 00:38:10 Nate Chamberlain Being respectful and responsible human beings, and so it's bringing in this this extra element where we're not just using tools anymore, but we're learning how to use them effectively. 00:38:21 Joe I definitely like Dwayne. 00:38:23 Joe I take advantage of the the teams delay on a chat. 00:38:29 Joe Definitely bit of a night owl. 00:38:30 Joe I get my. 00:38:32 Joe If I grew up on late at night, kind of that's where I I get. 00:38:35 Joe In focus mode. 00:38:37 Joe

And just to my friends.

Whatever it is, it's totally be totally fine and be comfortable with that. 00:39:04 Joe I've I've taken advantage of. 00:39:06 Joe I've got a little outlook rule that actually delays all my sent messages for like a minute. 00:39:11 Joe That's mostly just a CYA. 00:39:14 That I really. 00:39:15 Joe That I really mean to send that did I complete? 00:39:17 Dewayne How how mad was I when I clicked send? 00:39:17 Joe That message, yes. Yeah, yes. 00:39:21 Joe

Slightly differently, talking about, but yeah, taking advantage of those for who you're sending it to and

thinking.

About them, before you shove that requirement and request down to them that they can't do anything about, perhaps until the next day anyway.

But think about a hair salon where you've got 4 stylists and it's connected to each of their outlook calendars.

And then you say our business hours are 8 to 5.

So for a customer who wants to book time with them, they're going out to bookings and they're saying, OK, there are three stylists who have, you know, a 30 minute availability that could do this appointment.

And they can book it right there and schedule it immediately.

And it goes on these tier list calendar and the group calendar can see that there was a booking made as well during that time slot.

So we've we've had that for a while and then bookable time just came out which is personal.

So instead of having a team or a group, you've got your own outlook calendar and it allows you to have your own.

Like a portal for people to book time with you, whether they're inside or outside your organization?

And you can say I want to allow bookable time between let's say 11:00 AM and 1:00 PM just always have that available kind of as an open office hours thing.

And then there's a form people fill out to basically add themselves to your calendar.

They might have rebranded it because it it was kind of confusing at first to say, OK, well, I'm already using bookings. 00:44:56 Dewayne No, no, no, no. 00:44:57 Dewayne This is a new. 00:44:58 Dewayne Bookings really creative naming by the marketing groups over here. 00:45:05 Dewayne Yeah, bookings with me is I use it all the time. 00:45:08 Dewayne I have a link in my e-mail. 00:45:11 Dewayne For anytime I'm working with any customers and they need to drop something on my calendar and it only lets them book time that I'm free my bookable time, you know, makes sense. 00:45:22 Nate Chamberlain Yeah, yeah, I like that. 00:45:24 Dewayne I love that. 00:45:25 Dewayne It's a huge time saver. 00:45:27 Dewayne Is this discoverable?

Right now in the desktop client or.

I'm not sure about that.

00:45:32 Nate Chamberlain

I found it in the web client, so if you're using outlook on the web, go to your calendar specifically, and then there's going to be like right now, since it's new, there's going to be.

So the next one is kind of similar actually it's virtual appointments and this is something that's also kind of in the same realm of oh, is it bookings, is it new, is it old?

Again, it's kind of just a I'd say a Co rebrand of bookings, but it's an app inside of teams called virtual appointments.

And I think it might have gone this direction because of teams premium.

So in addition to having bookings, which now you can kind of manage through this virtual appointments app in teams, there are premium options you can upgrade to if you have teams premium.

And I can't remember what the specific options were, but you can do it all from teams now, but without upgrading to premium if you're just sticking on the base plan, you can still do all of your normal bookings activity through virtual appointments.

One thing I'll say about virtual appointments that I love, that was a differentiator for me is that the link that the recipient receives.

Browser which will work from a mobile device, so it doesn't try to open the teams client.

So if you're dealing with customers who may or may not have a teams account, you know like they don't use it, it will still work in a web browser from their mobile phone and just ask them to punch their name in and they'll install required on their part or setup which.

Lessens the friction that that's there to try to to, you know, collaborate with somebody.

So that's one of my favorite parts about it.

I guess that say like join from the desktop, join from you know download or join from your browser which is pretty nice.

That were modified and now there's two versions of them that you can choose from.

Those are both still there as they always were, but now there's two paired versions of those right next to them, travel requests with approvals and contest scheduler with approvals and what that means is if you use that template now, you can still modify some columns.

You can still add the ones you want, create the views you want as you normally would, but there's an approval status column that's added that.

Uses JSON basically to launch a power automate.

However you want to consider that, but basically it's it's manual.

You click on that button in that column and it you put in who's going to approve it and you give a note like hey, can you please review, you know subsection 4 make sure it looks good before you approve and then that person who's approving.

For those people, since you can do a multi approval on can approve right inside of teams and then it updates the list when they do.

Bond and then the other one is similar.

So again kind of sticking with templates around approvals and I want to encourage anybody who feels comfortable with Microsoft forms to look at this because the approval templates and teams are basically Microsoft forms.
