A way that a lot of people experience those apps.

And kind of seeing that happen, that's been I think important. I know some of our some of our users might be on an older laptop. You know as maybe a device they take in the field.

Having this app being able to still kind of work better on those kind of lower end devices potentially than their desktop is important for.

Some of our users that's I think that's one key to to start with.

Yeah, that's huge. That's huge. And I just, you know the the engineering that went into this was it was literally a rewrite like from the ground up complete like the framework that like when your house analogy.

It's it's not like just a facelift, it's a we ripped.

Out the foundation.

And started over like we we pulled out and started.

Took down the cabinets, pull up the floor.

It's kind of.

00:05:13 Dewayne

A big deal. You know the the underlying technology that the actual teams application itself was built upon is brand new and the new technology to your point is way more efficient. This is you know we've.

We've heard, and I you know, we both have seen like teams had a reputation of being kind of a memory hog. And so for users out there, you know, getting into nerdy numbers, running a laptop with, you know, 8 gigs of memory teams would maybe eat half of.

That's that's too much. That's a lot, especially for a field. Somebody in the field, right. You know, we try to focus on the land grant story, the Edu side of things, and it both in, in public education, it's not uncommon for laptops to not have.

Tons of extra memory, right? They're not all researchers running simulations and stuff like that. They're just folks out in the field, you know, doing their job. And so having 8 gigs of memory and 50% of that being eaten by one program, not a not a good day. So yeah.

Probably can get back.

00:06:27 Dewayne

That's a huge.

00:06:28 Joe

Probably get back, maybe even some battery life, maybe a few minutes if you're really running that.

You know, through your entire process out in the field that can help there too, perhaps. Yeah. I just find it to be a crisper interface, just cleaner, polished feel to it.

Fewer clicks to get to certain things now. There's a few more options that feel like.

You know, some feedback has helped to bring forward different types of options that are easier to, you know, easier to access or not hidden behind the meatball menu.

Taking better, taking better use of like the screen, real estate and menus and toolbars, it's been helpful to see.

Yeah, there's definitely a nice refreshing feel to the interface. I I have been running new teams exclusively for the last couple of months. I haven't switched back to classic teams. There are.

You know, let's be transparent here. There are reasons why you might need to switch back to classic teams. We'll put some nerdy links in the show notes if we have any, you know IT pros listening to this, we'll put some links in the show notes to some known issues and things where you may need to switch.

But the good news is the way that this has been made available.

There's just a slider switch at the top left corner of your teams client that makes it so that you can flip back and forth between what we're calling classic teams and new teams. And on my test computer, which is not.

Like a seriously powerful computer, it takes about 15 seconds to switch completely over from old teams to new teams or vice versa. So when you do find yourself in a situation where you have to switch, it's really not that bad. It doesn't put you out. It's not.

Like, it's not like the old school days of a service pack installing on your computer and you were down for an hour. You know, it's it's literally just a.

Few seconds you're not having to sign out to the app and sign back in or anything like that. So. And for those of you.

For me, I've seen the the known issues list and right now it's it's kind of long. But the issues that I experience.

Very few, I would say only two that come to mind that affect me in some way that I might.

I might switch over to the classic teams, but typically I will just jump into the web browser and do those couple operations and just stay right in teams 2.0. So I really have been in.

Early opportunity to get into teams 2.2.1 here. New teams. Yeah. Like he's like you. A few months ago and been running it pretty much exclusively.

The two.

As we're talking about it at this point, the two things that I encounter that I still use switch to a browser for is if I want to make an announcement.

Into a channel and give it a nice banner.

00:09:49 Joe

Give it you know an image of some sort. That's not a custom image.

Custom image.

00:09:55 Joe

Or the templates of images aren't available right now in new teams.

And you just get a color background, so you can change that and the other one is teams settings like you want to go in there and update.

The options on a team who can create delete channels, add, remove tabs, those kind of settings. I still jump over to a browser to do those, but those are the only.

Only two things I find that I administratively or in some way using this that I'm missing.

Yeah. Those so the team.

Pretty good.

00:10:29 Dewayne

Yeah, that's not too bad. I mean, I I would, I would say the same thing, same thing, the team settings thankfully is not something that I'm in often. So I don't notice it as much when I say like, oh, that's not there. But yeah, you're right. I've I have noticed that and.

Switching back and doing it, then switching back into new teams less than a minute total of time of your life to do that or to your point, if you've already got a browser window open signed in to Microsoft 365, just run teams in the Web browser real quick to to make that change and you're.

There you go.

The announcement thing. Yeah. Yeah, that, that's that's something that I think is going to be fixed. I mean, this is in public preview, so anytime something's in preview, it's not.

All the way done right? There's more work to be done, so it's expected that it will have the same or more features set than than old teams. Classic teams does. So I think we can expect that to be better in the near future. So it was regarding Anna.

Yeah. And we'll we'll put in the show notes. There's a nice document from Microsoft that's sort of tracking.

What's currently available in the app and they and they even track education separate from commercial because of the education specific pieces.

Are important in the teams, in our organization for education, but they also tell you like what's what's they haven't done yet, some big, you know, big items that aren't yet complete.

So you'll get an understanding for that. One of them was that I think they just actually.

Released is a Mac client. Yeah. So that was one that's still showing up on their website right now, but they did just get out on that client and.

Haven't heard any feedback on that just yet, but that'll be that's good to get the Mac users chance to start trying this out too.

Yeah, there's a there's a site. Super easy to remember, AKA dot Ms. is always like the the prefix, right? The the front end of short links from Microsoft. And if you want to check out information about new teams, really easy to remember. It's AKA.

Dot Ms. Slash new teams and that will take you to the landing page which has access to all kinds of information and this is for.

Both end users of computers as well as IT admins. There are links to flip books that go through new teams and why it's awesome and things that it does better. And then there are also links to documents for administrators to learn and understand how to.

Make this available to your end users and also links to the rollout schedules that will show when this could be available to your end users. If you leave all your admin settings alone and you know you don't go in there and touch them.

There is a uh.

Particular setting for teams update policy and if you leave it at the default, which is called Microsoft controlled, then Microsoft will decide when that toggle shows up and that's that's coming very soon and it's it's right around the corner. So if you're not seeing it yet, you might be seeing it soon.

Unless your admins have turned it off so.

00:14:08 Dewayne

But really good useful website. It is updated constantly, so I think you should definitely review it and look at it and use that as like your you know bookmark it, use that as your like landing page if you're curious about anything about new teams.

So for those administrative controls.

Let's say we've got a, you know, a university that's doing taking control of that setting, and it's not Microsoft controlled.

Or the users aren't potentially going to see that setting show up that toggle until the administrators decide they want to have it displayed.

But if you've got some early adopters.

00:14:54 Joe

There may be some champions of that tool. There's a way to enable a group of people set of users to get that toggle for team new teams if you want. So if you're not, don't see it. Maybe after after it probably should be seen. Maybe there's an opportunity to ask for a smaller set.

Of users who could start getting out ahead of that change.

00:15:18 Joe

And start trying it.

00:15:19 Dewayne

Out. Oh yeah, I would. I would 100% encourage any organization listening to this make this available to your at least to your IT admins, your champions, your power users. You know, if you're not comfortable just letting it out in the wild.

Make it available to those audiences so that you can be prepared for the things that are going to look different. You know, Microsoft has lots of support documentation that you can just hyperlink end users directly to it. You know, there's a lot of good.

About but it's still.

Really useful to have first hand you know real world feedback from your people about what they've noticed, cause everybody uses it a little bit differently, right? Like some things might matter to the daily workflow of one person that don't matter to another. And so getting that.

Feedback is is a really critical part of the of the rollout of this. So good good call out.

Yeah. And you said, you know, there's there's interface changes. There's some things that people are going to need to, you know, some some cheese has been moved. There's there's things that have been moved around and stuff like that. So getting an opportunity to get out ahead of that.

One of the.

One of the changes is around how channel chat works.

Yeah, yeah, channel conversations are.

00:16:44 Dewayne

Are flipping over.

00:16:47 Dewayne

We're in the upside down now.

Well, that sounds scary. You don't?

00:16:51 Dewayne

Yeah. And then not like the stranger things upside down, but.

Want to go there?

00:16:58 Dewayne

Yeah, that's a huge change. Channels have always relatively looked the same way since teams came out. This is a that's a big change, right? There's some something good though our we, you know, we stick to the Edu side of things. So for any of our commercial listeners.

Commercial listeners, this is maybe not right for you, but for Edu the what is being called the new channels experience or channels 2.0 maybe informally called.

Is only going to show up for you if you're using the new teams client.

And there are some pretty big.

Interesting changes to how channels are going to look. I overall, I think they're good though I think like formatting and stuff like that is it's.

It's good changes.

00:17:54 Dewayne

And with options coming right.

Yeah, yeah, the the yeah, flipping it up. So you've got the, you know, new new chat starts at the top.

Slows down. I appreciate that it starts.

In that kind of formatting mode, where you can more easily understand that you can do some advanced bold and italics and.

Underlines and things like.

That or stop access.

Mental posts cause, you know in the current implementation, when you start a new conversation in a channel, if you start typing and you hit the enter key thinking you're going to drop down the line, it just sends it, it posted it, and now you're frantically either deleting or editing, you know, whatever it was that you just.

Accidentally sent or in some cases you end up with fragmented conversations where some of it is in one post and some of it is in another. And that just makes things really confusing.

So yeah, I.

00:18:52 Joe

I think that's the other thing that this does is it brings that a single conversation sort of into a single thread and it more easily keeps you inside of a thread where you're written replying to that thread. It's it's definitely much harder now to accidentally create kind of a broken conversation.

And again, I think the ability to more easily see you know how to give a subject to your.

You know your message, your post, which is helpful is right there and you can still go ahead, make an announcement.

And that's more easily able to see now too.

Use. If I wanted to start a new post, that's kind of like front and center on the LinkedIn site. It's not at the bottom of my browser window, right? And so the new experience of channels kind of mimics that social media experience that people.

However, teams does not look like that ever, so teams has always been start a new conversation as at the bottom of your screen and your posts kind of flow upward, which is why we were jokingly calling it upside down channels.

Good news is there is going to be an option so that users can decide which one they like. So Microsoft's not going to force it on to you. I mean that's a relatively large.

Experience change, you know, that's that's a pretty big deal if if teams has been out for like, what, six years, something like that.

Having that flip upside down all of a sudden is is kind of a big deal. So so having an option I think is.

That's good. Yeah. I guess it gives you. It'll be interesting to see how, if that's in any way controllable by who knows a group policy or Intune policy or some sort.

Because, yeah, maybe. Maybe you got a lot of documentation out there. You need to change or something like that. Some screenshots and how how to how to operate. But I would hope that most adopt the kind of the top down, the new, the new style. I think that will.

Again, like you were talking about, it's just got a little more feel to the way most people probably are experiencing these type of threaded conversations in their personal life.

Well, and you know, we can think about different audiences too, like as people enter the workforce, right, they may be used to that social media.

Experience. And so when they look at teens, it will make more sense to them for it to look like that. And so they won't need to change it.

Versus your veteran users who have been using teams for years now, they're probably not going to be super happy that things, you know, got turned upside down. So I think that the option for to let the end user decide how they want to view it along with some coaching inside the app, you know like some tool tips that pop up and say, hey, did you know you could change this or something like that?

Is is a good approach? I think it's the best, the best way to kind of meet in the middle, so to speak.

My experience, and I would recommend if you feel like it's not working for you, give it a little bit of time. I I feel like when I first started using the new teams and the new channel experience, when I first would switch over to look at the app, I felt like I was, I was, I was looking in the wrong place initially to look at a channel, you know, looking looking down I mean.

I need to look up top and it took a little while for my eyes as I know I'm going over to look what's new.

00:23:53 Joe

To kind of move over to the top.

00:23:56 Joe

So give it, give it a, you know, give it a week or so you'll. You'll get a handle.

Handle of it. Yeah, I agree. I.

00:24:03 Dewayne

I'm using them upside down now. I got used to it.

But again, I'm all I'm all for end users having the option to decide what works best for them, so I appreciate that that's there, but that's not even the biggest thing. Like we've got a couple more things to talk about. We talked about the resource consumption, you know the RAM in your computer.

That's effectively cut in half.

00:24:31 Dewayne

You and I were comparing notes earlier and and and like I said, it's not uncommon for teams, you know, classic teams to eat, several gigs of memory. Looking at my task manager right now, mine is currently using 607 megs and we are on a call right now. Like I'm looking at you.

Right now, on a teams call, so it's not like I'm not doing anything. You know, I'm actually using it and I'm at, yeah, 610 megs of consumption right now and it wouldn't have been.

Uncommon for me to look at that and see that in the in the several GB range. So that's that's huge. Think about that from the perspective of like your your hardware managers, your your help desks that are specking out systems, you know that's a in a roundabout way that could equate to a cost.

Pumping up memory in computers so that they can run teams you know or well.

Not not can't joke about.

Or or older systems that you know. Maybe we were thinking about going out and buying memory and paying a technician to run out there and install some some chips in a computer. Maybe we don't have to worry about that. You know that's that's pretty cool to think about like an actual.

Not just a life improvement with it running better and feeling snappier, but it actually costing us less money. That's.

Know how you.

Probably saving some, probably saving some carbon units there and power and energy. So yeah, be something good there. I noticed. Like if in the classic like you said, if it's using a couple of gigs, I'm thinking well maybe it's cached, you know, a bunch of chat. I've been in a bunch of channels are cached there, but I'm finding that the lower usage on the new teams.

Wait, then more would come, and finding much snappier going through, you know, search things like that, jumping straight to where I need to be inside new teams is great.

We stick to a, you know, we have a, a, a thing for land grant universities, right? Like a passion for supporting that, that kind of mission. The land grant system is awesome. There's so many amazing things, innovative ideas and and research that comes from that. And then that research is taken out.

And extended alright to everyday people who get to learn about better ways to do things and and, you know, farmers and growers and all kinds of stuff that get to to learn from that research through the extension program.

Yeah, so the the need to have, like you said, a A teams app logged into one account and your browser running in another account and trying to decide which one should be in the browser and which one should be in the teams app.

Multi tenant multi account capabilities in the teams new teams app which and allows us to have sign in to one app with multiple accounts.

Which between them easily don't have to sign out sign in. You're signed into both at the same time.

And those both can hit two different organizations.

And seamlessly you can access A-Team across multiple organizations. You can seamlessly support multiple accounts from different organizations and you can stay signed in and receive notifications that stay on calls, switch orders during the call. It's I don't know what they did, but that's the most amazing thread.

Threaded threaded changes in here where these things are allowed to maintain and stay going and active.

Get all your notifications. It's it's great.

No more excuses that you, you know, you weren't signed in London so.

I missed the call because I forgot which account to sign it to.

Yeah, yeah. One of the things that you said, I wanna I.

And so this for the IT nerds that might be listening, this is a new feature called mtma. Sounds like the latest St. drug, but it's not. It's multi tenant multi account is what it stands for. And yeah of course check the show notes for links to documentation.

But mtma means that you can sign in to your teams app with multiple work accounts at the same time.

And when you receive messages, they just pop up on your computer like you know, I do this at work. I have the account that you and I use the the organization that you and I use to run our extension, you know, group our, our learning community. I have that signed into the same teams.

App as my work account, so if there's a message posted in that community and somebody tags me in a channel, I get a notification right away and when I click it, it just takes me right to that Channel. It doesn't disconnect me from anything. There's.

You know, long process of switching like you would as a as a guest, which we'll talk more about that in a minute, but there's no it's it's, it's really, it's really fluid, it's really smooth and they did. I don't it's.

It's magic. That's all I can say is it's magic. If if you don't have new teams yet and you're an extension agent, start asking for it because it is going to make your life a lot easier. The the ability to be in multiple accounts at the same time is something that people have been asking for since teams.

And if you're you're an IT person on this call who can help and manage this this you want this to because this will simplify your work on trying to train someone how to manage a separate browser, separate browser profiles, choosing which account to log into teams, all those go away with this. You know another group of people who probably want to lead the charge in getting access to this as it starts to roll out in preview.

Yeah. And that's that's kind of the second scenario that we are familiar with.

And the extension, you know landscape the the first one was you have two completely separate accounts. You have a county account, you have a university account, right? And you're jockeying between both of those. The other situation that we've seen is you might only have one or the other. So maybe you only have.

Relationships. Right. We used to joke here in Florida that we have 67 counties in the state of Florida and we would lovingly say that that meant we had to negotiate with 67 different governments. So just think about.

That pleasure. Right. And so it always goes a little bit differently depending on who you're talking to, right. We had some counties that, you know would say to the university, like, yeah, just manage all of our IT stuff. That would be great. You know, that takes it out. The burden off of our shoulders. Right. Cool. And we'd have other counties that would say, you know, well, we're more important than a fortune, you know, 100 company. Your relationship between your county and your university. If you find yourself in this situation, so the second situation would be I only have one account.

And again, going back in the in the way back machine, what was it episode eight, I think of our. Yeah, episode eight. We talked about what it, the nuances of being a guest in teams and now with teams 2.1 we should basically just delete that episode or just keep it for posterity.

Different now it's completely different. The experience is so much better.

The notification system you're definitely going to want to be familiar with that, and that's been enhanced too. So the ability to manage where a lot of these notifications might have gotten hidden previously, they do now have an, you know, opportunity to kind of surface up. So that's something you'll want to, you know, want to pay attention to.

And manage a little differently, perhaps in this situation.

Yeah, it's it's, uh. I'm gonna get into the weeds here just a little bit. When you when you add someone as a guest to your team, they're from another company.

That actually more or less creates an account for that person within your company.

And that's how you add them to the team. And I've seen situations where people will go into that super useful search bar in teams, right? And they'll search for their colleague. That's been added as a as a guest, and they'll just send them a chat message.

Well, that chat message isn't going to where they likely are working every day, which is their company, their county, their university, whatever, whatever it may be, it's going to their account that you created for them in your organization. And typically what would happen.

Is that person would receive an e-mail like an hour later. That said, hey, your work, you know your your colleagues trying to connect with, you know, they're trying to send you a message and they'll click the e-mail and it will force their teams client to switch over to that company because in classic teams, there's this notion of.

Of having to switch back and forth between companies, new teams.

So much better.

00:39:40 Dewayne

The way it works now in teams 2.1 somebody searches for you in their company. They find your guest account, they send you a message, it just pops up on.

Your computer and you answer it, and there's no switching. It's seamless. It just comes right through.

And probably should just talk about that if you've used to be doing that, there is probably a greater potential now where you could actually communicate to that person directly.

Guest account in your own organization where they.

Have to switch.

00:40:43 Joe

Teams client into your organization to actually chat with you. Just be aware that there's.

Potentially, depending on how your organization set up greater potential to communicate directly in chat.

With people outside of your organization. So if.

00:40:59 Joe

You're typically been doing that right now. If you still are, this is an opportunity to think about the ability to actually start a chat message directly with that person.

Outside of your work.

That's a good point. The the guest experience and the and the improvements that have been made around it, I feel like are working.

The the the whole train is working towards a more seamless experience regardless of how many organizations you're a member of.

I'm a guest in several different.

Organizations and it's so nice to be able to within just like less than a SEC.

Take a peek at any kind of activity that was happening. Could have been A tag and a channel. It could have been where they mentioned the entire team. It could have been a chat message that was sent to

me and those those things kind of pop up on my screen. And if they if I miss it, let's ignore it. Right. There's an activity feed.

That's specifically dedicated to activity that's happening in other organizations that you're a guest member.

00:42:11 Dewayne

Which is super useful and it gives you information without you having to really dig into it. So you can click it, it's going to be up at like the top right corner roughly of your of your teams app, and you'll be able to see like, oh, your name was mentioned.

Oh, a channel that you're a member of was mentioned, you know. Oh, you missed a chat message. And you can click that.

And dive right into it again, without it interrupting your normal flow of work. And so I think.

Wrapping this kind of part up, regardless of the scenario you find yourself in as an agent, as an extension agent, if you've got two accounts, you're covered by MTM, a multi tenant multi account.

Acronym Salad MTO, which stands for multi tenant organization.

And this is a situation that's not that uncommon thinking more around.

Academic medical centers, you know, or multiple, you know, fragmented university systems kind of thing.

But imagine your university.

00:44:50 Dewayne

It has its own Microsoft 365 subscription.

00:44:54 Dewayne

And that university also owns a hospital, and that hospital has its own Microsoft 365 subscription.

Multi tenant organization settings will let you automatically send to users over. You can actually like how you can share a document. You can now share a user and you can share your users to that other organization and they will be sent over as guests.

And those guest accounts are automatically admitted basically into that other system. And when you combine that kind of synchronization of user accounts with the feature set in new teams.

That means that's that's some pretty powerful stuff, because now you can search for people who are in that other company.

In your team search bar, you can find them just like they were a member of your own company. You can see their phone number. You can see the details on the people card, their job title, their e-mail address. You know those types of things. You can start chat messages with them.

Date and they've got to decide. And the Health Center has two accounts. Usually they've got a Health Center account and the university account, so it can be really confusing for.

Yeah, yeah. There's some new very new admin controls in the admin Center for setting up a multi tenant organization and it states that you can do up to five which?

You think about it. That's a lot like. We're not saying, hey, every university in the entire state of Florida should all like hook up and become the same.

That's not what it's for. The documentation is pretty clear that it says this is not for crossing organizational boundaries. So in that that illustration of where university we have a university and a hospital.

And we lived that and it was amazing to be with that group of people and just accept that and.
